9.2.2 Analysis of the Candidates' Performance

This report is based on a total of 24 candidates who sat the Hindu Religious Education examination in 2019. The total candidates had a mean of 19.88 and standard deviation of 5.57. There were 15 girls whose mean was 21.00 and a standard deviation of 4.97 and 9 boys whose mean was 18.00 and a standard deviation of 6.28.

The report gives the relative difficulty of each of the **thirty (30)** questions in the figure below. It also discusses an analysis of the candidates' response patterns in the poorly performed questions. Any question where the total number of candidates scoring correctly is 40% and above. Below 40% is considered to be poorly performed.

- i) There was a drastic decrease in candidature in the year 2019 compared to the previous years.
- ii) Lack of HRE teachers in the schools offering the subject has affected the performance leading to a slight drop in the mean.
- iii) There is need to train HRE teachers to encourage more schools and pupils to give priority to the subject.
