Read the passage below and answer questions 31-40.

Many people have a hobby of hunting for treasure. Yes there are the treasures hidden in out-of-the-way places waiting to be discovered. If you would like to find some, an electronic metal detector will help you in your search. The instrument, which looks much like a walking cane, has a white plastic plate at one end and a control panel at the other. The treasure hunter sweeps the white plate over an area, about one inch above the ground. If there is a metal treasure buried in the ground, the detector will give a beep. Then the treasure seeker knows where to dig.

Sometimes treasure hunters find rare coins, and sometimes they find coins that are not so rare. Some find antique items like old cowbells, horse hoes, articles used by blacksmith, and keys. People who hunt for treasure in old battlefields may find cartridge shells, brass buckets, or even an antique pistol. Some treasures hunters search for gold.

Electronic metal detectors are water and pressure proof. A good place to hunt for underwater treasure is in the coastal water of Florida. It has been estimated that in these waters there are up to two thousand sunken vessels, many of them Spanish treasure ships destroyed by tropical storms long ago.

Treasure hunters are dissatisfied when their 'treasure' turns out to be only one of those small metal pull tabs used to open a can of pop; but they don't give up. The next beep may lead to a real find.
