1. Give five reasons why the Bible is referred to as the word of God

- The author were inspired by God
- All the books of the Bible have the common theme of God's salvation.
- Users repeated speech from God
- God wrote the ten commandments.
- It contains God's revelation to human beings
- Explains the nature of God's holiness and power.
- Records experienced/encounters of great men with God.

2. Describe the first account of creation.

- Day 1-God created light and darkness
- Day 2- God created the sky
- Day 3- God created land, seas, oceans and plants
- Day 4- God created heavenly bodies (sun, moon, stars)
- Day 5- God created sea creatures and birds.
- Day 6- God created domestic animals, wild animals and man.
- Day 7- God rested on the Sabbath.

3. Identify five promises to Abraham by God

- Give Him and his descendants land to dwell.
- Would give many descendants/father of great nation
- Would bless him and his descendants
- Would protect him
- Would give him a son
- Abraham would live longer and die in peace
- Would make hi descendants kings
- Would bless all nations through him
- Would make Abraham's name great/famous
- Would deliver Abraham's descendants from slavery.
- Would bless those who bless him and curse those who curse him
- Would establish an everlasting covenant with Abraham and his descendants.

4. Give five instructions that God gave to the Israelites during the Passover night.

- On the 10<sup>th</sup> day every man to select and slaughter a young lamb without a blemish
- Smear the blood on their door posts
- Roast the lamb wholly without breaking bones
- Eat unleavened bread
- To eat bitter herbs
- Eat while fully prepared and in haste.
- Remain indoors until morning to escape the angel of death.
- Burn left-overs in the morning
- Israelites women to borrow jewels and clothing from Egyptian women.
- Commemorate passover annually and be taught from generation to generation.

5. Identify five failures of King Solomon.

- Married many foreign wives who worshipped idols.
- Built temples for pagans gods worshipped by his wives.
- Introduced forced labour in Israel.
- Killed his half brother Adonijah.
- Introduced high taxation in Israel.
- Valued himself more than God ie build his palace in 13 years and temple for 7 years.
- Sold part of Israel territory to repay debt.
- Was extravagant in a way he used wealth belonging to state.
- Practised nepotism by exempting his tribe men from forced labour.
- He hired skilled pagan craftsmen from Tyre in construction of Temple.
- Made treaties with other nations
- Forced Israel's sons into his army and their daughters to work in his palace.

6. State evils committed by Jeroboam that contributed to widespread Idolatry
- Made 2 golden calves at Dan and Bethel to act as visible representative of Yahweh.
  - Ignored Jerusalem as the religious centre.
  - Made Israelites to offer sacrifices to the golden calves
  - Made worship place on hilltops.
  - Chose priests who did not belong to the levites
  - Instituted religious festivals/feast in the months of his choice.
  - Burnt incense at the altars of idols.
  - Led revolt that led to splitting of Israel as God's kingdom.

7. Give five ways in which traditional African people worshiped God.

- Through sacrifices
- Through offerings
- Through prayers
- Through invocations
- Through dancing and singing

8. Identify five reasons why dowry was given in Traditional African communities.

- Was a sign of thanksgiving to the girls parents.
- A sign to replace the girls presence and labour in the family.
- Sign of contract and commitment that man was ready to marry and live together with the girl.
- Evidence that man would be able to take care for the wife and family.
- Sign of generosity on the man's side.
- Strengthen the relationship between the two families.
- To guard against unnecessary divorce of the families.

9. Give five Jewish expectations about the Messiah.

- Expected a political leader who would overthrow their Roman colonial ruler.
- A messiah who would rule the world from Jerusalem and receive tributes.
- Would be a descendant of David/from royal/ rich family.
- His kingdom would be more powerful but temporary.
- Would come after the return of Elijah.
- Would not associate with the sinners, poor or Gentiles.

- Would uphold/enforce Judaism/Mosaic law.
- Would perform wonders and miracles.
- His kingdom would be established through God's judgment on Israel enemies.
- His kingdom would be preceded by cosmic signs/powers.

10. Describe the annunciation of the birth of Jesus.

- Angel greeted Mary.
- Mary was highly favoured among women.
- The lord was with Mary
- Mary was not to fear/be afraid.
- She had found great favour with God.
- She was to conceive and bear a son whose name would be Jesus.
- The son would be great and would be called son of the most high.
- God would give Him the throne of His father David.
- The son would reign forever.
- The Holy spirit would come upon Mary and conceive.
- The angel revealed to Mary that Elizabeth was 6 months pregnant.
- Mary accepted the angel's message in humility and obedience.

11. State five relevances of John's teachings in Christian life today.

- John would give light to those in darkness and guide them in the path of peace.

13. Give five reasons why Jesus was rejected at Nazareth

- Jesus had claimed that Isaiah's prophesy had been fulfilled through him.
- Failure to perform miracles He had performed at Capernaum.
- Accused Jewish forefathers for rejecting God's prophets by persecuting and killing them.
- Unfavourably compared the Jews with the Gentiles.
- Accused Him for breaking the Sabbath law by healing.
- They expected the messiah to come from rich/royal family but Jesus came from a poor background.

14. Describe the feeding of the 5,000 people by Jesus.

- As Jesus was teaching, the day began to wear away/get dark.
- Disciples requested Him to send the crowd away to go into the village to seek food and somewhere to sleep.
- Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat.
- Disciples told Jesus they had only 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish.
- Jesus told disciples to settle the crowd down in groups of fifty.
- Jesus took the five loaves of bread and 2 fish, looked up into heaven, blessed and broken them and gave them to the disciples to give the crowd.
- All the people ate to satisfactory and about 12 baskets of left overs were left.

15. State five teachings by Jesus on the cost discipleship.

- Pray for those persecute them.
- practice self-denial/suffer for the sake of Christ
- Love Jesus above everything else

- Not judge/condemn others
- Have strong faith
- love their enemies/not revenge.

17. Describe Jesus triumphant entry in Jerusalem.

- If the owner asked them why they are untying the colt, they could tell him that Jesus is in need of it.
- As they untied the colt, the owner asked them and they responded to him as Jesus told them.
- They brought the colt to Jesus and He sat on it.
- As He rode on it, people spread garments on the road.
- The people rejoiced and praised God for His mighty works.
- They said that blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.
- Some Pharisees told Jesus to rebuke his disciples.
- Jesus told them that if people were silent, the stones would cry out.

18. Outline five teachings of Jesus on Eschatology.

- Temple and city of Jerusalem will be destroyed.
- Many will come claiming to be Messiah.
- There will be wars and rumours of war.
- Natural calamities ie earthquakes, famine, pestilence e.t.c.
- Strange and celestial creatures will appear from the sky.
- Believers will be persecuted, arrested and imprisoned.
- Believers will be hated an account of Jesus.
- Believers will be put to death.
- People will faint from the fear of witnessing the signs.
- The son of man will come in a cloud with power and great glory.

19. Describe events that took place during the lords supper.

- Jesus took His place at the table with His disciples.
- Told disciples that it was the last supper with them.
- He took bread, gave thanks, broke it amongst His disciples to share.
- Told disciples that bread represented His body and to be taking it for His remembrance.
- Jesus took cup of wine, gave thanks and gave it to His disciples.
- Told disciples that the wine represented His blood poured for them in new covenant.
- He disclosed that His betrayer was amongst them.
- Disciples questioned amongst them who would be the betrayer.
- An argument arose about who could be the greatest among them.
- Jesus told them that whoever wants to the greatest should become the youngest.
- He predicted about His denial by Peter.
- He told Peter that He had prayed for him.
- Peter resisted that he could deny Jesus.
- He reminded His disciples about His sufferings which had come so that the prophecies could be fulfilled.
- Jesus left for Mt. Olives to pray.
