- 1. (a) Expectations of the Jews about the Messiah.
 - He will come from the lineage of David.
 - He will be a political leader.
 - He will conquer nations.
 - He will establish a powerful kingdom for the Israelites.
 - He will set the Israelites free from their enemies.
 - He will perform miracles.
 - He will appear after the return of Elijah.
 - He will enforce the law of Moses.
 - He will appear in Jerusalem full of glory.
 - He will not associate wit h outcasts. (6x1 = 6mks)
 - (b) What Simeon and Anna the prophetess revealed about Jesus during the dedication.
 - He would save people.
 - He would bring glory to Israel.
 - He would be a light to the gentiles.
 - He would be a universal saviour / He would save the whole world.
 - Many people would oppose his work.
 - He would reveal the secret thoughts of people.
 - He would bring the redemption of Jerusalem. 4x2 = 8mks)
 - (c) Reasons why children should be introduced to the worship of God at an early age.
 - To create in them an awareness of God.
 - To learn the true teachings of their church.
 - To learn to trust / obey God / give themselves to God.
 - To enable them become members of the church.
 - To emulate the example of Jesus.
 - To learn on church doctrines / teachings of their church.
 - To familiarize themselves with religious practices of their church.
 - To give a sense of belonging to the church community. (6 x 1 = 6mks)
- 2. (a) Ways in which John the Baptist prepared the way for the Messiah.
 - He asked people to repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins.
 - He warned them of God's punishment on sin.
 - He condemned the evils of the tax collectors and soldiers.
 - He asked them to share with the poor.

- He warned them not to be proud that they were Abraham descendants as that did not make them righteous.
- He told them about the messiah who was to come who will be mightier than him

(b) Healing of the women with a flow of blood.

- As Jesus went to Jairus house people pressed around them.
- A woman who had a flow of blood for twelve years came behind Jesus.
- He touched the fringe of the garment of Jesus.
- He got healed immediately / the flow sopped.
- Jesus asked who had touched him as some power had gone out of him.
- People denied it.
- Peter explained that the multitude was pressing on him.
- Jesus replied that someone touched him as some power had gone out of him.
- When the woman saw that she could not hide anymore she came trembling.
- She explained how she touched him and was healed immediately.
- Jesus told her that her faith had made her well and to go in peace.

(c) <u>Identify ways in which</u> the church is continuing with the healing ministry of Jesus.

- Christians pray for the sick.
- They provide guidance and counseling services
- They provide preventive / curative drugs / treating the sick.
- Pay medical expenses for the sic.
- They give medical information / provide through electronic / print media on health issues.
- Provide basic needs / food / shelter / clothing to the sick.
- They visit the sick.
- Train medical personnel.
- Preach against evils that interfere with good health.
- They construct hospitals / health centres / rehabilitation centres.
- They lay hands on the sick / anoint them. $(7 \times 1 = 7 \text{mks})$
- 3. (a) <u>Four areas of conflict between Jesus and the Jewish religious leaders.</u>
 - The Sabbath Jesus healed on the Sabbath day and the law said no work should be done

- on the Sabbath.
- The divinity of Jesus He claimed to be the Son of God.
- Jesus association with sinners / outcasts. The Pharisees did not expect Jesus to associate

with sinners as he claimed to be a holy person.

- Jesus teachings. Jesus directly condemned the Pharisees and called them hypocrites.
- Jesus claimed to be the Messiah while the Pharisees expected a political messiah.
- Jesus was popular. The popularity of Jesus threatened the authority that the Jews had.
- Jesus failed to observe the tradition of the elders and Pharisees e.g. washing of hands.

(b) Ways in which Jesus prepared His disciples of his coming death.

- He talked three times about his death.
- He talked about his resurrection.
- He allowed some of them to witness the transfiguration.
- He had a last meal with them.
- He told them about his betraval.
- He told Peter that he will deny Him.
- He appointed Peter to be the leader.
- He asked His disciples to pray for time will come when he will not be with
- He promised a helper after he was gone. (6x1 = 6mks)

(c) Importance of resurrection to Christians today.

- It is the basis of Christian faith as if Christ never resurrected there would be no Christian faith.
- It gives hope for eternal life.
- It encourages Christians that they will overcome death.
- It confirms that Jesus is the son of God.
- encourages Christians to face suffering as Christ suffered and resurrected.
- It led to the coming of the Holy Spirit.
- It was a fulfillment of Jesus promise to His disciples.
- It gives hope that Jesus will come again. (6x1 = 6mks)
- 4. (a) Teaching of Jesus on the role of the Holy Spirit.
 - The Holy Spirit will come to replace his presence.
 - The Holy Spirit will come to counsel.

- The Holy Spirit will comfort the disciples.
- He will remind the disciples what Jesus taught.
- He will reveal the future.
- He will guide the disciples to the right.
- He will enable disciples to witness about Christ to the whole world.
- He will empower the disciples to speak with courage / to perform miracles. (7x1 = 7mks)

(b) What the symbol of the bride reveals about the unity of believers.

- Church is the bride and Christ is the bridegroom.
- The church is loved by Christ just as the bride is loved by the bridegroom.
- The church must remain pure waiting for Christ as the bride remain pure for bridegroom.
- The bride waits patiently for the bridegroom as the church waits for the second coming of Christ.
- The bridegroom comes to take the bride to her permanent home as just Christ will come

to the church / believers to their new home.

The bride remains expectant of the coming of the bridegroom as believers are always

ready for Christ. $(4 \times 2 = 8 \text{mks})$

(c) Reasons why Christians should work in unity.

- In order to promote oneness of Christ.
- To promote teachings of Christ.
- To share resources / minimize expenses.
- To have effective evangelization / to enable them preach the gospel.
- To have a common attitude towards church / Christian practices.
- To prevent formation of splinter groups / cults. (5x1 = 5mks)

- Participate in environmental day.
- Give financial support to environmental programmes.
- Report those destroying the environment to the relevant authorities.
